MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS: Certified Physician's Assistant (PA-C) or Certified Nurse Practitioner (CNP), with current South Dakota license.

JOB FUNCTION: The Clinical Research Project Clinician will work closely with the Principal Investigator to implement phases of COVID-19 prevention randomized clinical trials including conduct of eligibility screening examinations, limited physical exam and measures, medication management, and follow-up assessment. In addition, the Project Clinician will work with a Clinical Research Nurse Coordinator, Clinical Research Nurse, and Recruiter to implement these tasks and ensure that project activities are completed in a timely and professional manner. This position requires at least a half-time commitment from the successful applicant. Full-time employment may also be possible.

PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS: Active medical license as noted above. History of working with Indian Health Service or American Indian Tribes or communities. Excellent organizational and administrative abilities and superior communication skills. Personal computer skills, including Internet, Windows, and MS Office365.
